

The Phand'ulwazi Knowledge Centre

This Knowledge Centre at GWC is intended to be a resource for the global church and to preserve Evangelical Reformed Theology.

The isiXhosa word "Phand'ulwazi" means to search for knowledge. This Knowledge Centre is overtly theological in nature. The undergirding assumption is that the Bible is a library of books where the many form a unified whole, and all 66 books have one message that is centred upon Christ.

This Knowledge Centre will lead the way in promoting a synthesis between books and electronics, between what a library has always been, and what it needs to become.




Gospel roots for South Africa's youth
